

# FROG & TOAD CALLS HEARD IN COLLIER COUNTY

## GROUND LEVEL, NEAR WATER

<i>sounds like</i> <i>location</i>	<i>frog/toad</i>	<i>common calling</i>
low, loud, pig-like grunt..... water	<b>Pig Frog</b> .....	ponds, ditches with deep water
finger rubbing across..... a balloon or a chuckle <b>alarm call:</b> single, high-pitched squeak followed by a splash	<b>Southern Leopard Frog</b> .....	water, may be on road during rain

## GROUND LEVEL, DRIER AREAS (MAY BE NEAR SWALES OR STANDING WATER.)

<i>sounds like</i> <i>location</i>	<i>frog/toad</i>	<i>common calling</i>
sheep-like..... meadow <i>whaaa-whaaa</i>	<b>Narrow-mouthed Toad</b> .....	woods, near water,
Soft, musical cricket-like ..... plants, chirp, trill or dripping water areas	<b>Greenhouse Frog</b> ..... (not native)	side of road, potted near buildings, damp
finger rubbing teeth of a..... and small comb, high raspy trill water	<b>Florida Chorus Frog</b> .....	base of grass clumps other vegetation near
tinkle of glass,..... very high pitched leaves	<b>Little Grass Frog</b> .....	near water, esp. ditches may be on stems or
clicking two marbles..... bushes, trees together	<b>Southern Cricket Frog</b> .....	grassy areas with
chick-like..... <i>peep-peep</i> (chorus can be deafening)	<b>Oak Toad</b> .....	ground under trees

high, musical trill.....**Southern Toad**.....edge of puddles, water,  
often on road during  
rain

low snore or.....**Gopher Frog**.....cypress heads  
woodpecker drumming permanent ponds

**Cane Toad**  
purr, log drum (aka Marine Toad or Giant Toad).....residential areas  
woodpecker drumming (not native)

### ON PLANT STEMS IN TREES & SHRUBS

<i>sounds like</i>	<i>frog/toad</i>	<i>common calling location</i>
cowbell-like, musical or <i>whank-whank</i> raining: single, high-pitched bark	<b>Green Treefrog</b>	on stalks, stems, branches
raspy, <i>quank-quank</i> raining: angry squirrel	<b>Squirrel Treefrog</b>	on stems, stalks, leaves, branches
like typing, Morse code, ticker tape machine	<b>Pinewoods Treefrog</b>	high in trees
distant barking dogs barking seal	<b>Barking Treefrog</b>	from trees
slowly rubbing a finger over a balloon	<b>Cuban Treefrog</b> (not native)	buildings, trees near buildings
